Valentine lived from approximately 175 AD to 269 AD. It was during the years of the Roman Emperor Claudius II (268 AD to 270 AD) that Valentine was brought into captivity.

Claudius II fought many wars during his reign and needed the enlistment of many men to fight these wars. However, the men were not coming forth to enlist as soldiers. Claudius II assumed the men were not enlisting because they were married and had families. He put forth a ruling that single men were not to be married which would lead to their enlistment into the army.

Valentine, a priest, did not abide by this ruling. He secretly married many couples and also helped many persecuted Christians. Claudius II found out about Valentine's disobedience and imprisoned him. Claudius II tried to convince Valentine to worship idols and to give up his deep faith in Christianity but Valentine refused. Instead of accepting the idol worshipping custom, Valentine tried to convert Claudius II to Christianity.

While in prison, Valentine prayed daily to God. One guard, who overheard Valentine praying, requested a special prayer for the healing of his daughter who could not see. Valentine prayed to God for the restoration of the daughter's sight. In time, the daughter's sight was restored.

Claudius II did not acquit Valentine of his disobedience. Around 269 AD, Valentine was beheaded for the disregard of the law and for the refusal to renounce his faith of Christianity.

In 496 AD, Pope Gelasius proclaimed February 14th as the day in which St. Valentine would be honored for his martyrdom. February 14th was believed to be the day in which St. Valentine died.

- St. Valentine is the patron saint of engaged couples, lovers, bee keepers, greetings, love, travelers and young people. He is also the patron saint against the plague, fainting and epilepsy.
- St. Valentine's Day is celebrated throughout the world on February 14th of every year. Love, romance and kindness are shared with others through the giving of gifts such as candy, cards, flowers and jewelry. The color red is associated with St. Valentine's Day along with chocolate, cupid and the shape of a heart.

The first Valentine's Day cards were handmade with ribbons and lace. During 1847, Ester Howland of Worcester, Massachusetts, began the mass printing of Valentine's Day cards. Since then, the practice of gifting a card to a loved one became popular. In today's world, other gifts are also given to those who are smitten with each other or who care for each other. Gifts can include a special dinner, a perfectly chosen card, a special bouquet of flowers or any special love from the heart. Only one's imagination is needed in fulfilling the love for this day.

WASHINGTON COUNTY FIRE DEPARTMENT RECEIVES LOWER ISO RATING

Washington County Fire Department located at 3868 Gables Drive Sunny Hills recently received a lower ISO rating improving from a 7 to 5. The best ISO is a 1 and the worst is a 10 so the lower the score, the better the rating. The ISO rating looked at the county's communications system, fire department staffing/equipment and the water supply available for fire suppression. The lower fire rating should result in decreased homeowner insurance rates. "The dedication and hard work of our volunteers as well as the recent SAFER grant received by Washington County which provided full time fire personnel Monday thru Friday at the Sunny Hills station, helped significantly reduce the ISO rating for our department", said Chief Al Gothard. The recent installation of new fire hydrants also played a major role in improving the water supply in Sunny Hills which is one major component of the rating system.

Common Flu Symptoms

Unlike cold symptoms, signs of the flu tend to come on suddenly.

You might have: Fever above 100 F ,Severe aches in your muscles and joints, Weakness or severe fatigue Warm, flushed skin and red, watery eyes, Chills, A headache, A dry cough, A sore throat and runny nose

Adults with seasonal flu don't usually have stomach problems like vomiting or diarrhea, but children sometimes do. Get medical help right away if you have: Trouble breathing or shortness of breath, Pain or pressure in your chest or belly. Sudden dizziness, Confusion, Severe vomitina

These symptoms can mean your illness is severe.

Flu Symptoms vs. Cold Symptoms

The symptoms of colds and flu can be a lot alike. Here's how to tell which one is making you sick:

Fever. It can last 3 or 4 days with the flu; it's rare with a cold.

Aches. They might be severe with the flu; they're mild with a cold.

Chills. You're likely to have them with the flu, but they're rare with a cold.

Fatigue. This is common with the flu and happens sometimes with a cold. Sneezing. You're more likely to have this with a cold than with the flu.

Cough and chest discomfort. This is com- People who are otherwise healthy don't mon with both but tends to be severe with usually have serious problems from the the flu.

Stuffy nose. This sometimes happens with the flu but is common with a cold.

Headache. This is common when you have the flu but rare with a cold.

How to Treat Flu Symptoms

In most cases, the best things to do when you have the flu are: Rest at home. Drink plenty of fluids.

Avoid contact with other people.

Your doctor might give you prescription medications called antiviral drugs if vou're at higher risk of complications, such as if vou:

Are very sick or have other medical conditions

Are vounger than 2 or older than 65 Have a weak immune system

Are pregnant

Are a Native American or an Alaska Na-

These medicines -- baloxavir marboxil (Xofluza), oseltamivir (Tamiflu), peramivir (Rapivab), and zanamivir (Relenza) -work best when you take them 48 hours or less after your symptoms start. If you take them during this window, they can cut your illness short by a day. They can also help after 48 hours if your illness is severe.

Flu Complications

Flu complications include:

Pneumonia, Sinus infection (sinusitis), Sore throat. This can be common with the Ear infection, Inflamed bronchial tubes in your lungs (bronchitis), Asthma flare-ups, Heart inflammation (myocarditis), Brain inflammation (encephalitis), Muscle problems, Chronic heart disease flare-ups, Organ failure

When Is Flu Season?

Seasonal flu follows a pattern, starting in the fall and ending in the spring. The first sign is often a sudden rise in the number of school-age children sick at home. This is soon followed by more illness in other groups, including parents.


